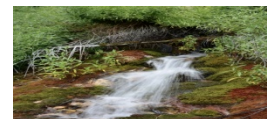
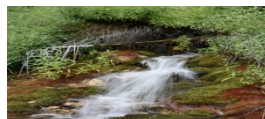
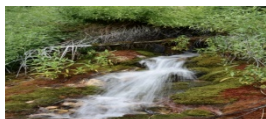

National Stormwater Calculator

The Environmental Protection Agency provides a stormwater calculator that helps users decide which stormwater management practices are most appropriate to install such as a rain garden, filter strip, or a green roof. The calculator is a desktop application that estimates the annual amount of rainwater and frequency of runoff from a specific site anywhere in the United States. Estimates are based on soil conditions, land cover and rainfall records. The calculator is designed for those interested in reducing runoff from a site including: site developers, landscape architects, urban planners, homeowners and others.
